SUMMER NATURE PROGRAMFull-day nature camps for children ages 5-12

Our summer nature program is called "Nature Day Camp". Children spend full days exploring in small groups with trained nature educators. Our staff are caring, active, curious about nature, and welcoming. Each day, campers join organized activities where they learn about nature and spend open-ended time hiking, playing games, and exploring as a group.

CHILDREN'S NATURE PROGRAM - SUMMER SCHEDULE

Children are divided by age into small groups of 10-12 campers

Choose the price that works for your family: \$30, \$75, \$150, \$225 or \$300 per week

All nature camp programs start at 9am and end at 3:30pm. Campers must be dropped off by an adult.

Drop-off window: 8:15-9:00am | Pick-up: 3:30pm | After-care (optional): 3:30-5:30pm

What a day of camp is like... Children gather at the meeting spot in the park and find their nature educators. Each day starts with a morning welcome, group activity, snack, and guided educational projects or activities related to the nature theme. Then the group hikes and explores the park, stopping for lunch, snacks, and water when they need them. Children may play games in the trees or grassy areas, do crafts, sing silly songs, do puppet shows, build forts, collect nature items, or pretend to be birds or animals. Camps take place rain or shine, and even though we are outdoors exploring, there are bathrooms or portable restrooms available for the children.

TWO LOCATIONS EACH WEEK - NATURE TOPICS LISTED BELOW

Week one - June 22-24 Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park or Powell Butte Nature Park Nature Theme: Invertebrates (Children look for and learn about bugs, spiders, worms, and centepedes)

Week two - June 27-July 1 Attend the program at <u>Sellwood Park or Hoyt Arboretum</u>

Nature Theme: Birds (Children look for common birds and learn about their habits, nests, and how they survive)

Week three - July 5-8 | Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park

Nature Theme: Pollinators (Children look for and learn about bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds)

Week four - July 11-15 Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park or Powell Butte Nature Park Nature Theme: Rocks and Volcanoes (Children learn about local rocks and how volcanoes shaped our city)

Week five - July 18-22 Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park or Hoyt Arboretum

Nature Theme: Trees (Children learn about trees and who lives in and around them)

Week six - July 25-29 | Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park

Nature Theme: Habitats (Children explore different habitats and learn about how plants and animals work together.)

Week seven - August 1-5 Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park or Sellwood Park

Nature Theme: Water (Children explore a pond or river and learn about the birds, animals, and insects living there)

Week eight - August 8-12 | Attend the program at Sellwood Park or Hoyt Arboretum

Nature Theme: Mammals (Children look for and learn about common mammals like squirrels, moles, and mice)

Week nine - August 15-19 | Attend the program at Mt Tabor Park

Nature Theme: Plants (Children learn about common, local plants through observation, art, and projects)
